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11 But when Christ came as high priest of the good things that are now already here, he went through the greater and more perfect tabernacle that is not made with human hands, that is to say, is not a part of this creation. 12 He did not enter by means of the blood of goats and calves; but he entered the Most Holy Place once for all by his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. 13 The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer sprinkled on those who are ceremonially unclean sanctify them so that they are outwardly clean. 14 How much more, then, will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from acts that lead to death, so that we may serve the living God!  
(Hebrews 9:11-14)

2. How does Christ fulfil the requirements of the law on our behalf and how is He able to cleanse us from our sin?
3. According to Hebrews 9:23-28, where does the serious work of Christ's ministry take place and what benefits do we receive from him? What office does he hold for our behalf (v. 11)?
4. What is meant by describing Christ as the true sacrifice in the true sanctuary?
5. What is the difference between an external cleansing and an internal cleansing?
6. What does it take to cleanse a man from sin?
7. How do we receive the forgiveness of our sin and the cleansing of our conscience?
8. Once we are cleansed by the blood of the lamb, what does God expect us to do?
